(Leader):

And now, Holy One, as we gather at your table, we remember how, on the night before he died, Jesus gathered with his friends for a final meal.

He broke bread and helped them to understand how he was giving himself as nourishment for a spiritually hungry world:

"This is my body, broken for you. Whenever you eat together, remember me."

And when the meal had finished, he helped them understand

how he had poured himself out completely to help humanity perceive the emergence of God's kin-dom:

"This is my life poured out for you. Whenever you share the cup, do this in remembrance of me."

(ALL):

Gracious God,
may your ever-present Spirit
bless these gifts and this gathering.

may these elements become sacred
