SCRIPTURE READINGS

Genesis 2: 4b-9, 15-23

In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, 5 when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up—for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; 6 but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground— 7 then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

8 And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. 9 Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

15 The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. **16** And the Lord God commanded the man, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; **17** but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.'

18 Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.' 19 So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. 20 The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. 21 So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. 22 And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. 23 Then the man said,

'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken.'

Proverbs 8: 1-3, 22-31

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Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? 2 On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; 3 beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: The Holy One created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. 25 Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth— 26 when God had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. 27 When the heavens were established I was there, as the Lord drew a circle on the face of the deep, 28 Making firm the skies above, and establishing the fountains of the deep, 29 assigning to the sea its limits, so that the waters might not transgress the holy command, and marking out the foundations of the earth,

then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily God's delight, rejoicing before God always,

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rejoicing in the inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

Luke 18: 15-27

15 People were bringing even infants to Jesus that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. **16** But Jesus called for them and said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. **17** Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.'

18 Then a certain ruler asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' 19 Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. 20 You know the commandments: "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honour your father and mother."' 21 He replied, 'I have kept all these since my youth.' 22 When Jesus heard this, he said to him, 'There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' 23 But when he heard this, he became sad; for he was very rich. 24 Jesus looked at him and said, 'How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! 25 Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.'

26 Those who heard it said, 'Then who can be saved?' **27** He replied, 'What is impossible for mortals is possible for God.'

EXPLORING THE WORD: "Creativity, Play, and Building God's Kingdom" with Dr. Mary Ann S. Saunders

Mary Ann is a white settler trans woman and nonbinary femme who lives on the stolen territories of the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh peoples. She is a life-long Anglican whose faith and spiritual life were immeasurably deepened when she transitioned about 10 years ago. She works at the University of British Columbia where her teaching and research is wide-ranging. These days she's most proud of research she's done on the effects of AI gender-recognition technology on trans and gender-diverse people, and a course she developed which focuses on children's and young adult fiction by trans and nonbinary authors.
